

Kurt Cobain – Glossary

addiction noun [count or uncount]
a strong need to keep taking an illegal or harmful drug

album noun [count]
a CD, record, or cassette with several songs or pieces of music on it

baseball noun [uncount]
a game played by two teams of nine players who score points by hitting a ball with a bat and then running around four bases

bean noun [count]
a seed of various plants that is cooked and eaten, or a plant that produces these seeds

cheerful adjective
pleasant or enjoyable, and making you feel happy:
bright cheerful colours

coach noun [count]
someone who trains a sports player or team:
a baseball coach

deliberately adverb
with a definite intention, and not by chance or by accident:
Police believe the fire was started deliberately.

depression noun [uncount]
a feeling of great sadness that is sometimes so extreme that it is considered to be a mental illness:
Some children show signs of anxiety and depression at exam time.

despite preposition
used for saying that something happens or is true even though something else makes it seem unlikely:
He still loves her, despite the fact that she left him.

form verb
to start to exist, or to make something develop:
The club was formed in 1972.

grunge noun [uncount]
a type of rock music played on electric guitars that developed in the late 1980s and was influenced by funk and heavy metal

lead noun [count]
the main person or part in a play, film, or television programme:
She's playing the lead in her school play.

movement noun [count]
a group of people who work together in order to achieve a particular aim:
the peace movement

pregnancy noun [count or uncount]
the condition of being pregnant, or the period of time when a woman is pregnant

psychological adjective
involving or affecting your mind:
Harry's problems are more psychological than physical.

rebellious adjective
opposing authority or the accepted rules of society

songwriter noun [count]
someone who writes songs

star noun [count]
a famous and popular actor, entertainer, or sports player:
a Hollywood/pop/soccer star

successful adjective
achieving the result that you want:
The team has had a highly successful season.

suffer verb
to have a particular illness or physical problem:
patients suffering from heart disease

ultrasound noun [uncount]
a way of producing an image of an organ or of a baby inside someone's body, using sound waves

worldwide adjective, adverb
happening or existing all over the world:
Our company employs 1,500 staff worldwide.
