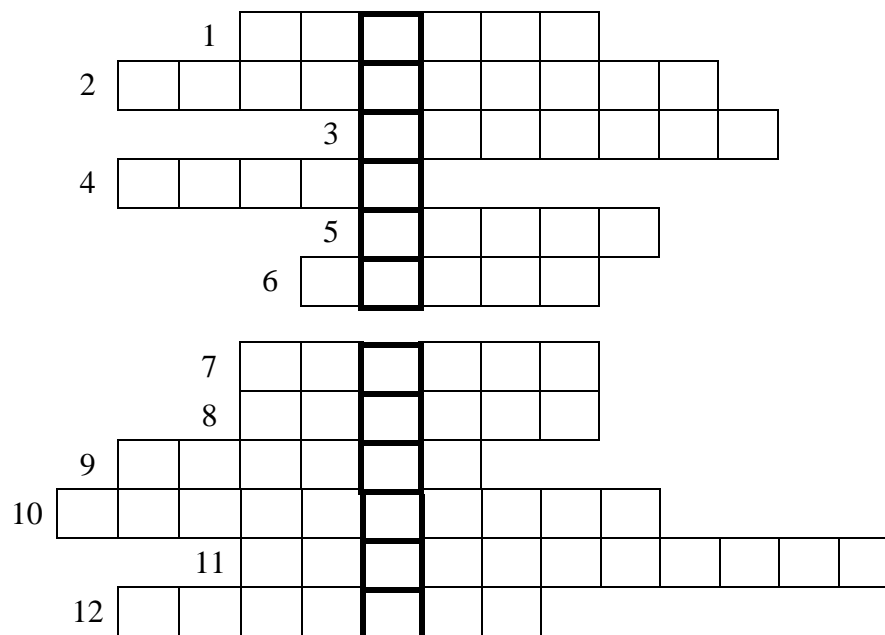
1. This country, although one of the largest in Europe, has a population of only about five and a half million. It has lots of lakes. Its language is one that not many foreigners speak.
