

Cat Passenger - Glossary

abandoned adj

left alone by someone who should stay with you and look after you

a home for abandoned children

approach verb [intransitive/transitive]

to move closer to someone or something

She heard footsteps approaching from behind.

disappear verb

to be impossible to find

The letter I had left on my desk had disappeared.

district noun [count]

an area of a town or country

They live in one of the most exclusive districts of Paris.

fare noun [count]

the money that you pay for a journey

Have you given the kids the money for their bus fare?

get on well phrasal verb

if people get on, they like each other and are friendly to each other

I get on well with most of my colleagues.

habit noun [count]

something that you do often or regularly

They were in the habit of going for long walks.

jealous adj

unhappy because someone has something that you would like or can do something that you would like to do

Other girls were jealous of her good looks

joke verb [intransitive]

to say things to make someone laugh

You shouldn't joke about such serious things.

let out verb

To allow something to happen

Open the windows and let some fresh air into the room.

passenger noun [count]

someone who travels in a motor vehicle, aircraft, train, or ship but is not the driver or one of the people who works on it

More than six hundred passengers boarded the ship.

regular adj. [only before noun]

used for describing people who go somewhere or do something frequently

Jason was a regular customer in the shop.

ring the bell phrasal verb

to make a bell produce a sound

He rang the doorbell.

route noun [count]

a way that buses, trains, ships, or planes travel regularly

the West Coast route

senior citizen's bus pass noun [count]

in the UK, a special ticket that allows people over the age of 60 to travel by bus without paying.

traffic noun [uncount]

the vehicles that are travelling in an area at a particular time

At that time of night, there was no traffic on the roads.

unusual adj.

different from other people or things in a way that is interesting

The designers have chosen unusual colour combinations.

vehicle noun [count]

a machine that you travel in or on, especially one with an engine that travels on roads, for example a car, bus, van, truck, or motorcycle

the driver of the vehicle

watch the world go by phrase

to sit or stand somewhere and enjoy watching other people as they pass
